

"Durintache Tmir Jao" This is the excerpt from the "Psaydan" of Saint Dnyaneshwar Mauli. Dnyaneshwar Maharaj says, remove darkness in the lives of the oppressed, deprived and under-privileged people. Respect their lives. If there is a need to eradicate the darkness of their life, if we want to bring a light in their life, then it can bring only through the light of knowledge & education. It is necessary to make such opportunities available to the students of this class.

It is our duty to cater quality education and foster them to be a part stream, in this determination, on 15th June 1959, 'Shikshan Prasarak Mandal, Anandur' was established on 15th June 1959 to provide the quality education and knowledge-based light to reach the slum.

Education was not available in the area before 1959. In the pre-Independence era, this region was ruled by the Nizam of Hyderabad. There was no education facility. There was Urdu medium school at Naldurg. My primary education was inaugurated at Naldurg in Urdu medium. After independence, Marathi medium schools were started. For secondary education, I had to go to Tuljapur. In Tuljapur there was not the facility of Boarding, that's why it is necessary to go to school by cooking myself. In this way, matriculation in 1952 was completed. For college education, I got admission in Dayanand College, Solapur. In 1956 I completed my B. Sc. Soon after, there was an interview in Hyderabad for

appointment as a teacher in the education department of the district council.

My selection was made in this interview and selected as a primary teacher and was appointed at village Padli. Being a graduate, I was transferred to a secondary school of Majalgaon as a secondary teacher. I worked here for one year. Then again I transferred and for two more years I have been serving at school of Renapur.

During this I learned so many things, I acquired the knowledge, I got an opportunity to render my services as well as to develop my personality. But many of my friends who have had a basic education with me do not even learn, despite their desire to learn. They did not get the opportunity. , Those eligible and desirous friends had to be deprived of education; the painful thing of this remained in my heart during this period. I became restless and start to think on this issue.

During this time I collect and gained the lot of good experience, good students were able to prepare. In the work of this place, I thought that in the year 1959, the 'Shikshan Prasarak Mandal' was established and the school was started by discussing with the leaders of the village Anadur that I should go to our village and run an organization instead of doing job with wondering one to other village.. I resigned from government jobs and started working as a teacher in this school from June 1959.

Message By Secretary

The **Jawahar Vidyalay** a secondary school of this institute. In 1961, the first matriculation batch was seen. Since then, the school's results are good. Many students today are proving their achievements in various fields by taking education from this school. Many students of this school take a prime position in the Merit list of the S. S. C. Board.

In the year 1994, Sachin Haralkar stood first in the whole state of Maharashtra during his S.S.C Board Examination. In 1981, Prashant Katikar and in 1989 Ajay Kandale came first from Aurangabad (Marathwada) Division of S.S.C. Board Examination. Dharmanarayana Misale in 1990 and Atul Surawase in 2008 won the first rank among the students of Backward Classes . In 2018, Rishikesh Kanade secures 100% marks and K. Vedanti Dudhbhate achieved the level of 99.60% marks in the S.S.C.Board examination.

There was a facility of up to class XII. But hundreds of students of this area were forced to go to college either at Solapur, Naldurg, Tuljapur or Umarga for college education. Girls are deprived of higher education because their parents are not ready to send girls for long higher education. Hence, by introducing Mahatma Gandhi's birth anniversary, on October 2, 1991, "Jawahar Arts, Science and Commerce College" has arranged for higher education at Anadur. It is possible due to this college that poor, needy and budding children of the area are able to get higher education.

In the past 27 years to till now, thousands of students are working in various

fields by acquiring a degree from this **Jawahar College.** Some of them students work abroad. I am very satisfied and proud of it

Our highly well qualified Professors always attentive and take efforts for the overall development of rural students by imparting innovative teaching, by proper counselling and disseminating knowledge to inculcate moral values among them.

Various professional training is imparted to develop skill enhancement among the students, to be self-reliant. Preparation of competitive examinations, introduction of new technology is made in this college.

While giving special importance to the empowerment of girls, fashion design, cosmetics- Buety Therapy, Food and Fruit processing industries etc. efforts are being made to make them self-sufficient and competent with add on training simultaneously during their formal education.

"Duritanche Timir Jao", this is the result of the determination that I made in 60 years ago. Whenever the alumni co me to meet, the mind is filled with the satisfaction of their face. I please. Is blessed

Welcome to Jawahar Arts, Science & Commerce College, situated at a holy and historic place village Anadur located on Pune – Hyderabad N.H. no. 65 It is a matter of great pride and honor to lead Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Jawahar Arts, Science & Commerce College, Anadur, Dist. Osmanabad at this historic, juncture, into the 60th Anniversary year of Shikshan Prasarak Mandal, Anadur beginning from 15th June 2019.

The parent body, Shikshan Prasarak Mandal Anadur was established by the great visionary teacher and versatile personality, Ex. MLA Hon. S.N. Alure Guruji in 1959 with the aim of 'Duritanche Timir Javo" i.e. Eradication of darkness from the lives of poor people through lighten rays of education. He always endeavours to provide quality education in vernacular language to all poor and needy peoples. From a modest beginning SPM has blossomed into a centre of excellence, on the academic map of Maharashtra.

This Shikshan Prasarak Mandal, Anadur was the first educational institution in the vicinity of village Anadur to be run by a private body and is now one of 20 institutions and 7 hostels under its umbrella.

There was no facility of higher education at Anadur till 1991. To cater the need of higher education for poor & needy students Hon. S.N. Alure Guruji has decided to start college and established Jawahar A.S.C. College on 2nd Oct. 1991, which is the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, as Guruji is a follower of Gandhian Philosophy.

Now this Jawahar College is in its 28th year of encouraging innovation in education. The college has successfully completed two cycles of NAAC receiving the CGPA score 2.81 with 'B⁺⁺ grade.

The college is located on the NH-65 (Pune-Hyderabad) with a spacious and natural 17 acre campus. It is comprises of spacious building, a sprawling sports ground and other academic infrastructure which is manned by efficient staff. This meaningfully supports the quality of undergraduate programs which are offered in the three main faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce.

As a part of our efforts to enhance the skill development of our students, keeping this in mind the Jawahar College has envisioned the introduction of skill development courses that would prepare our students for the



demands of job market and enhance their employment prospects. From this academic year 2019-20 College has plan to start skill based Certificate Programs in spoken / communication English, Yoga, Naturopathy & Ayurveda, Tally & Accounting, Mass communication & Journalism under the Add on Certificate Courses.

Admission Procedure

- Student desirous to take admission in the college should go through the college prospectus carefully.
- Candidate seeking admission the courses of offered by the college shall follow the notified admission schedule strictly.
- The application form should be filled in by the candidate in his/her own hand writing legibly.
- Candidate seeking admission to first year B.A./B.Sc./B.com. Must have filled the on time registration form of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathawada University, Aurangabad, for getting admission in the college.
- The application form attached with requisite documents should be submitted to the office in time. Form received after last date till not be taken into consideration.
- Gap year would be no bar for the purpose of admission to the first year undergraduate courses, but reason for the same must be given through notarized gap certificate.



- After scrutiny of the forms, a merit list will be prepared and displayed/ flared on the notice board or contact the office for details.
- The selected students will have to pay the required fee immediately or within the time limit given by the college, otherwise the admission will be treated as cancelled.
- The students availing any type of concession must submit the required concession form at the time of finalizing their admission.

Note: -

- No admission will be given on duplicate T.C.
- Admission to the backward class students and girls will be as per Government rules.
- The admission rules & fees structure may change as per the directives of University/ State Govt.

Documents Required at the time of Admission -

The applicants shall be required to produce following documents in original with two sets of Self attested photocopies at the time of admission.

- 8. Income Certificate for the year from Tehsil.
- Caste Certificate (Two attested copies for all categories except general Category)
 The students who have completed 18 years of the age have to submit photocopy of election card.

Readmission:

Re admission will be permitted only on availability of seats and as per the conditions framed by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathawada University, Aurangabad.



Refusal of Admissions:

Refusal of Admission is the prerogative of the Admission committee and Principal.

Note: For students from Boards other than Maharashtra state Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, following additional at documents will be required.

- Migration certificate of the last Board from which you have passed XII Exam.
- Verification of mark sheet form the respective board;
- If you fail to submit migration certificate by 31st August, a late fee will be charged as per the university rule.
- Once you submit the original TC it should not be returned. The XII Mark sheet will be returned
 after verification & eligibility by the University. So student should keep at least 10 Xerox copies
 of TC and Mark sheet with them before submitting the documents to the office.

Academic Session:

The academic session will commerce from 15th June, Regular classes of all the courses irrespective of declaration of result will start from the same day; as mentioned in the academic calendar. The Classes of first year will start as the admission process is completed and will be notified on the college notice board.

Dress - code -

College Uniform & ID -

It is compulsory to all the students to come to the college in uniform with Identity Card. Color of the Uniform -

For Boys: Pink Shirt, Black Trousers (Pant),

White socks & Black shoes.

For Girls: Pink Kurta & Black Sal war and

Black Dupatta with Black Belly shoes.

If Girls desires to wear uniform as shirt and pant as mentioned for boys will be allowed.

Attendance Requirement:

- 1. Student must attend all the classes (Theory as well as Practical). Internal/ pre-annual examinations, tutorial, assignments, Games, Co-curricular and extracurricular activities are also compulsory.
- 2. If the attendance falls below 75% in each subject in each semester/term the student will not be allowed to appear in the University Examination.



Medium of Instruction:

Medium of instruction for all courses will be English and Marathi as per the choice of the students. But for Science course will be English only.

Library and Reading Room:

The college has sufficient number of books in the library. The student must observe the instructions of Library Department to use the Library books. College has the facility of Reading room where the large number of newspapers Journals and magazines are available. Students should make maximum use of the library especially in their off periods. The college library has INFLIBNET; DOAB & DOAJ access the e-books & e-journals.

Library Timings:

Reading Room - 8.30 to 5.00 p.m. Circulation - 10.00 to 4.00 p.m. Lunch - 1.00 to 1.30 p.m.

Code of conduct for Students:

- Students shall seek admission in the college on the basis of merit in the qualifying (XII)
 examinations according to the rules and regulations of Government of Maharashtra and Dr.
 BAMU, Aurangabad.
- 2. The admissions are open to all eligible candidates irrespective of caste, class, creed, gender, nationality.
- 3. Any student involved in breaking or damaging any laboratory or college properly will be punished severely.
- 4. Every college student should wear college uniform, and keep college I-card with them. When any one of the college staff will ask to show for any purpose of visit to the college, you have to show it.
- 5. Students should look their vehicles and keep them systematically in their allotted parking places.
- 6. Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited in the classrooms, laboratories, library and corridors of college. Strict discipline should be maintained in the college camps.
- 7. Smoking or chowing of any types of tobacco products in college campus are strictly banned.
- 8. To maintain high standard of academics, student should attend every lecture, practical, preannual exams, tests, tutorials, seminars, workshops of your subjects, Minimum 75%



attendance in theory and practical for each student is compulsory. Students having less than 75% attendance shall not be allotted to appear in semester examination.

- 9. Student should honest and ethical in their behavior on the campus.
- 10. Student should respect all staff, other students and people on the campus.
- 11. Students should actively participate in the academic (curricular), co-curricular and Extracurricular activities as sports, cultural and also contribute to the planning, organizing and conducting such activities.
- 12. Every student has to remove the scarf used to cover the face by them as main entrance gate of the college.

Medical Examination:

- Every student of the college shall present himself or herself for medical examination, before the Medical Team of college on notified date or dates as may be fixed by the Zoology Department in consultation with the Principal.
- Students who remain absent for medical examination at the appointed date and time without any genuine cause shall be fined by the college.
- Without medical examination, students will not be allowed to appear in University Exams.

Continuous Internal Evaluation:

- The college conducts Internal Examinations like Unit Test, Open Book Test, Tutorials, Assignments, Projects, Quiz and Practical in whole academic year/session. Presence and appearing in the Internal Examinations is compulsory to all students.
- A student who remain absent for such examinations shall be penalized by college.
- The college organizes student's seminars, workshops and holds group discussions in the respective departments.
- Besides, the college conducts a Preliminary Examinations in theory as well as practical prior to the University Examinations. Every student has to appear in the Preliminary Examination without fail Heavy fine is imposed to the students who violate this clause.
- Evaluation card for every student is prepared which duly signed by the parents and brought back to the college within 3 days from the date at issue after every Unit Test/ Internal Evaluation event.
- The respective department will conduct remedial classes for academically weak students.
- Some additional courses and innovation project are provided by the respective departments for the advanced dearness.

Disciplinary Rules:

- The activities of every student are monitored through CCTV cameras.
- The student found violating any of the above guidelines would be liable for punishment and the decision taken by the Discipline Committee of college shall be final and binding on the student.
- The Discipline committee of the college also reserves the right to take any appropriate disciplinary



action in any other situation not set in these rules of the decision of the college authority shall be final.

- Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college premises as per the directives of Maharashtra Government.
- Copying during the examination or indulgence in any forgery, impersonation or any other unfair practices during any of the examinations or submission of assignments will be liable for strict disciplinary action.
- Use of mobile phone or any other electronic gadget by a student in the examination hall is strictly prohibited, failing which the student shall be liable for a strict disciplinary action.



मातृभाषा मराठीचे महत्व व इतिहास

मराठी ही मुख्यता महाराष्ट्राची मातृभाषा आहे. महाराष्ट्र, गोवा, दमण आणि दीव, दादरा आणि नगर हवेली या ठिकाणी राज्यभाषा म्हणूनही तिचा वापर केला जातो. मराठी ही भारतातील बावीस अधिकृत भाषांपैकी एक आहे. मराठी भाषा ही भारतात सगळ्यात जास्त बोलली जाणारी चौथी भाषा आहे. मराठीच्या व-हाडी, कोळी, मालवणी, कोकणी अहिराणी, खानदेशी अशा पोटभाषा आहेत. मराठी भाषा २००० वर्षापासून अस्तित्वात आहे. म्हणूनच मराठीला अभिजात भाषेचा दर्जा मिळवून देण्याचा प्रयत्न चालू आहे.

१९८७ नंतर यादव काळात मराठीचा मोठ्या प्रमाणावर वापर केला होऊ लागला. कारण यादवांनी मराठी भाषेला प्राधान्य दिले. यादवांच्या शेवटच्या तीन राज्यांच्या काळात ज्योतिष, आयुर्वेद, पुराण, वेदांत इ. वर मराठी साहित्य (गद्य आणि पद्य रूपात) तयार करण्यात आले.

आज मराठी ज्या रुपात जिवंत आहे ती फक्त छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराजांमुळे, त्यांच्या काळात मराठीला खरे महत्व प्राप्त झाले. शासकीय कामकाज आणि बोलीभाषा म्हणून मराठीचा विस्तार झाला. पण इंग्रजी माध्यमातून शिक्षण प्रणाली आल्यापासून मराठी माध्यमातील शिक्षणाला महत्व देणे कमी झालेले दिसत आहे.

मराठी भाषेतील साहित्य कथा, कविता, कादंबरी, नाटके, प्रवासवर्णने, निबंध लघुनिबंध ह्यांचा दर्जा बिघतला तर अतिशय गर्व वाटतो. मराठी साहित्यातील साहित्यकारांनी आपल्यासाठी अतिशय मोलाचा ठेवा टेवलेला आहे. ते आपण मुलांना वाचण्यास प्रवृत्त करायला हवे आपल्या महाराष्ट्राला बऱ्याच थोर संतांच्या ठेवा लाभला आहे. त्यांना आपल्यासाठी जे दर्जेदार लिखाण करुन ठेवले आहे त्यांचे अध्ययन, पठन, चिंतन करायला हवे.

मराठी ही एक प्राचीन आणि सुंदर भाषा आहे. तिला अभिजात भाषेचा दर्जा मिळाला पाहिजे. बदलला काळानुसार इंग्रजी, हिन्दी किंवा इतर भाषा शिकणे गरजेचे असले तरी मराठी भाषोमध्ये जो गोडवा आहे तो इतर कशातच नाही. आपण वेळेनुसार बदलेले पाहिजे पण याचा अर्त अशा नाही की आपण आपले मूळ, आपली भाषा, मराठी संस्कृती विसरली पाहिजे. आपणाला आपली भाषा, संस्कृती याचे जतन करुन इतर भाषेच ज्ञान घेणे गरजेचे आहे.

आपणाला आपले मूळ, आपली भाषा, आपली संस्कृती याचे जतन करता यावे आणि आपली मराठी भाषा सर्वश्रेष्ठ कशी आहे हे जगाला दाखवून देण्यासाठी, आपल्या संस्कृतीचे जतन करण्यासाठी आणि त्याचे संवर्धन करण्यासाठी मराठी भाषेचे ज्ञान घेणे गरजेचे आहे.

त्याचबरोबर व्यावसायिक दृष्टीने सुध्दा मराठीचे ज्ञान असणे अत्यंत महत्वाचे आहे. महाराष्ट्रात असतो व महाराष्ट्राबाहेर मराठी जिथे जिथे बोलली जाते त्या ठिकाणी मराठी भाषेचे ज्ञान घेणाऱ्यांना नौकरीची संधी मिळू शकते. दुभाषक, वृत्तनिवदेक, संपादक, सूत्रसंचलोक, साहित्यिक, कवी नाटककार इत्यादी अनेक माध्यमाद्वारे आपणाला आर्थिक मोबदलाही मिळवता येतो. आणि त्याद्वारे आपण सन्मानाने आणि स्वाभिमानाने जिवन जगू शकतो. यासाठी आपणाला 'मराठी' विषयाची पदवीसाठी निवड करुन ज्ञान संपादन करणे गरजेचे आहे.
